

# A Wine Tasting Event: An Exploration of Old vs. New World Wines with Food Pairings

## Featured Wine Information

### Grenache:

2016 Domaine Bosquet des Papes Chateauneuf-du-Pape A la Gloire de Mon Grand-Pere (WA 96, JD 97, V 94, WS 94): The top cuvée of the Boiron family drawn from a single parcel of old vines and made using the traditional methods of Chateauneuf du Pape. 2016 Horsepower Grenache Sur Echalas (WA 96, JD 97, WS 94, V 92): Made by Christophe Baron, a living legend in Washington wine, this grenache is cultivated using horses rather than machinery from a unique high-density vineyard in Walla Walla.

### Syrah:

2015 E. Guigal Cote Rotie Ampodium (WS 97, JD 97, WA 95, V 95): An outstanding cuvee from one of the most iconic and esteemed producers in the Northern Rhone. 2015 was perhaps the best vintage in Cote Rotie's history. 2014 Saxum Syrah Booker (WA 97, JD 97, WS 94, V 94): From Justin Smith at Saxum Vineyards (a winery in such high demand that it takes 5+ years to obtain a spot on the mailing list), this wine comes from the Booker Vineyard, one of the top sites in Paso Robles.

### Bordeaux varietals:

2014 Château Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande (V 97, JD95, WS 94, WA 93): This 2nd Grand Cru Classé from Pauillac is known for its elegance and finesse, while still retaining the power of its cabernet sauvignon backbone. 2017 Bevan EE Tench (WA 96, JD 98): Russell Bevan is one of the best winemakers in Napa, and the Bevan EE Tench is his version of a classic Bordeaux blend with grapes coming from three top vineyards, including the Tench vineyard, located next to Screaming Eagle in Napa.
